

1. Objective

Niche Education Group Pty Ltd (Niche), as a Registered Training Organisation, must comply with all relevant Commonwealth, State or Territory legislation and regulatory requirements relevant to its operations and its scope of registration.

Niche must ensure that its staff and clients are fully informed of legislative and regulatory requirements that affect their duties or participation in vocational education and training.

2. Scope

This policy applies to all staff, students and stakeholders of Niche, including all divisions of Niche (Australasian Academy of Cosmetic Dermal Science, Australian College of Beauty Therapy, Australian College of Specialist Make-Up) and where a third party service provider undertakes training and assessment of training.

Third party service providers are required to comply with the relevant Commonwealth legislation and regulations relevant to the State or Territory they operate and relevant to the scope of training delivered.

3. Responsibility

It is the ultimate responsibility of the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to ensure compliance with legislation and regulatory requirements.

The Administration Manager assists the CEO and Compliance Officer to identify changes in the legislation and regulations and updates the relevant staff, students and stakeholders.

4. Implementation

CEO, Education & Training Managers, Administration & Compliance Managers and Marketing Mangers.

5. Policy

Niche will comply with all Commonwealth and Sate legislation and associated regulatory requirements relevant to its operations and its scope of registration.

6. Procedure

- Niche conducts half yearly reviews to highlight changes to legislation that may affect Niche.
- The relevant legislation regulatory information is detailed in the staff induction manual. Which is provided to new staff members.
- The Compliance Manger distributes any changes in legislation and regulations to relevant personal or third party service providers via various means such as memo, email, updating of policies and procedures on the website or staff meeting.
- This Policy & Procedure is updated and published with other policies relevant to students on the website to inform them of the current requirements.
- This Policy & Procedure forms part of the Partnering supplied to all third party service providers, which is updated as required.
- The CEO will make an annual declaration on compliance to the Standards for RTOs 2015 to ASQA, in particular whether Niche:
 - Currently meets the requirements of the Standards across all of its scope of registration and has met the requirements of the Standards for all AQF certification documentation in has issued in the previous 12 months; and
